A moment of silence was observed for Dennis Damata and David Wahlstrom. Mr. Damata was a long serving police officer for the Town of Wareham, a Selectman, and most recently the Code Enforcement Officer for the Board of Health. He died of Covid-19. Mr. Wahlstrom was a long serving member of the Wareham Fire District, as well as a former Marine. His death was attributed to cancer.

3. COVID-19 UPDATE: Dr Weigandt explained the Town has improved the website by adding a link to Covid -19 news and information. She explained that there had been a slight spike in the number of cases due to the Thanksgiving holiday, and the Christmas holiday, where it was likely that large groups would have gathered to celebrate. She also expressed concern that citizens be vaccinated before any of the new variants of the disease appear in Massachusetts.

Mr. Ethier explained that the Town has applied to the Commonwealth through the Board of Health to be an authorized vaccination site. He has worked with the Plymouth County Coalition for Health, as well as Southcoast Health, the Gleason YMCA, as well the school department to put together a program for 'drive through vaccinations.'
