Selectman Tropeano moved that I, the Clerk of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Wareham, Massachusetts (the "Town"), certify that at a meeting of the board held April 2, 2019, of which meeting all members of the board were duly notified and at which a quorum was present, the following votes were unanimously passed, all of which appear upon the official record of the board in my custody: Voted: that we hereby determine, in accordance with G.L. c. 70B, that the amount of the cost of the \$90,474,183 school project authorized by a vote of the Town passed on October 22, 2018 (article 5) and excluded and excluded from the limitations of Proposition 2 1/2 (so-called) by a vote of the Town passed November 6, 2018 (Question 4), not being paid by the school facilities grant is \$38,664,944 and we hereby approve of the issuance of notes and bonds not to exceed such amount under the G.L. c.70B. Further voted: that the sale of the \$9,415,000 General Obligation School Project Loan, Chapter 70B Bonds of the Town dated April 9, 1029 (the "Bonds"), to Raymond and James & Associates, Inc. at the price of \$10,092,858.10 and accrued interest, if any, is hereby approved and confirmed. The Bonds shall be payable on April 1 of the years and in the principal amounts and bear interest at their perspective rates, as follows: (see attached). Selectman Scarsciotti seconded.
