a. Trash disposal presentation by Weston and Sampson.

Present before the Board: Michael Scipione

The current agreement between Wareham, Marion, and Carver for trash disposal will be ending December, 2020. Mr. Scipione provided a presentation focusing on the primary future options that works best for homeowners. (see attachment)

He explained that he had received three proposals from ABC, Republic, and Waste Management. The fees used in the presentation were the average of all three and strictly estimates of what the cost will be. He also stated that the townwide curbside pick-up would be a five year contract with the possibility of two one year extensions and a 2% annual increase.

Topics of concern were the increasing costs and a deadline for the new trash disposal service. Mr. Sullivan stated he would like to send out a survey to hear feedback from the residents. He also requested approval from the Board to continue working with Mr. Scipione to devise the best agreement.

**MOTION:** Selectman Tropeano moved to allow Town Aministrator Derek Sullivan to continue working with Michael Scipione from Weston and Sampson on the trash disposal service agreement. Selectman Whiteside seconded.





# Current Solid Waste Situation

Trash Disposal at SEMASS (and Recyclables) at \$0 per ton – Ends December 2020



- CMW Operates 2 Transfer Stations Paid by SEMASS Ends December 2020
- CMW Landfill Operated by Covanta (SEMASS) Expected to End December 2020
- Town is Negotiating a Final Agreement for Future Disposal with SEMASS

# Current Solid Waste Situation

- 4,600 stickers sold for Transfer Station Use at \$40/sticker
- Approximately half (48% est.) Use Transfer Stations
- Approximately half (52% est.) Use Curbside Subscription Service
- Information on Solid Waste & Recyclables is Limited

## Considerations

- Costs for Solid Waste and Recyclables will Increase
- True for Both the Town and the Homeowners
- In Most Cases
- Solid Waste Disposal will Increase from \$0/Ton to around \$80/Ton
- Recycling Processing & Disposal will Increase from \$0/Ton to around \$100/Ton
- What Level of Service is Desired?
- Presentation will Focus on Options and Costs for Homeowners

# Primary Future Options for Homeowners

- No action All Homeowners Use Subscription Service
- Town Acquires Rt 28 Transfer Station
- Operates it for Town Residents only
- Remaining Residents Use Subscription Service
- Sub-option add Town of Carver
- Town-wide Curbside Collection

## Option 1 - No Action

**Subscription Service** Per Republic - Typical \$36 month/house \$432/year/house — current cost

Add materials management cost of\_ \$130/year/house

# Option 2 — Wareham only Transfer Station

Transfer Station, assume 4,600 stickers \* - Others use with Subscription Service

Operational costs Capital costs







# Summary of Options-Estimated Cost per Household

No action (no town service)

\$562/year/household

Route 28 Transfer Station

\$295/year/household - TS \$562/year/household - SS

Town-wide Curbside Collection

\$313/year/household

If placed on the Tax Rate approximately \$0.67/\$1,000 of Assessed Value (under \$200/Yr for the average single-family home)
