
## WAREHAM REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY MEETING MINUTES

- Discussion Land Disposition Agreement Negotiations with Master Developer of Tremont Nail Factory
  - a. Process will be to have Bentley produce a draft to initiate the negotiations.
  - b. Judith Whiteside moved to ask Bentley to generate an LDA to start negotiations, seconded by Kenneth Buckland. Vote: 5-0.

- 2. Discussion and Possible Vote: Town Meeting Input for Spring and Proposed Articles for Fall Town Meeting
  - a. Richard Swenson asked if we should consider not postponing the WV1-R.
  - b. Kenneth Buckland suggested that we could double up with a WV URP in the fall
  - c. General feeling was that we should stay the course, and plan on the fall for WV1-R with an URP proposal.
- 3. Report: State/DHCD Approval of Slum & Blight Studies
  - a. Kenneth Buckland was hoping to have documentation saying it was approved, but it hasn't arrived yet.
- 4. Discussion and Possible Vote: RFP for Urban Renewal Plans for Downtown and Onset Villages
  - a. Discussion around the relationship between the S&B studies and an URP. Kenneth Buckland reported that yes, the S&B study approval provides the justification to start executing an URP.
  - b. Discussion around a letter of scope that has been received from a consultant who assists towns execute URPs.
  - c. Discussion around possible grant money to help fund the cost of consultants

- Discussion and Possible Vote: Permitting and Disposition of 'CEDA' Parcel at Bay Pointe
  - a. Kenneth Buckland reported that one method to advance on the development project would be to split off 5 acres for the condo development project, and only permit that property.
  - b. General feeling of the WRA was that this proposal was not in Wareham's best interest.
  - c. Kenneth Buckland will invite a BayPointe representative to next WRA meeting to explain in more detail.
- 6. Ongoing discussion of WRA-related properties:
  - a. Decas School
    - Discussion on asking the BoS to authorize the WRA to post an RFP, based on the SRPEDD recommendations, as decided last meeting.
      - General feeling was that the BoS must come up with a process to determine the future use of Decas School, and the RPF/SRPEDD approach was too blunt.
      - 2. BoS will be asked at 5/11 meeting what process they suggest for determining the best use of the property, and how the town proceeds after that.
    - General discussion around revenue/costs/services and the conflicts that arise when there are more and more requests for services with less and less revenue.

    - RFP submission deadline had to be moved to 5/12 due to a posting issue.
