Agenda Item 1 - Update on the start of the school year

We have five Haitian immigrant students joining the WHS student body. Mr. Palladino does not think this addition will be difficult to absorb. WHS currently has a low ELL student count and excellent teachers, including Joe Marcus, and a teacher from Haiti.

Agenda Item 3 - Re-emphasis of the cell phone policy

Agenda Item 6 - Boiler Project

The boiler project at WHS was originally scheduled to be completed August 28, 2023, but due to chain supply issues that have caused a delay. We expect additional testing at the end of the week.

The project is almost complete, the company and project manager have been great to work with.

The next project is the fire alarm system which needs to be updated. It is a significant project to occur over the summer and it is expected to go out to bid soon.

We are also expecting the Auditorium lighting to be replaced and expect bids to begin soon on that as well.

Agenda Item 9 - Plans for staff inservice on October 6, 2023
