The first appointments would be staggered with two terms expiring in 2023, two terms expiring in 2024 and three terms expiring in 2025. And the committee name would be Wareham Youth Advisory Committee.



I hereby make complaint hereon, that the dog owned or harbored by:

Adam Bruneau 18 Naushon Rd Wareham, MA 02571

Is dangerous by reason of aggression:

1. The dog, described as a 10 year old, male, American Bulldog, named Flash, had broken through the backyard fence and attacked the neighbor, Ernest Trox, inflicting serious injury.

On October 15, 2021 I was dispatched to 18 Naushon Rd for a reported dog attack. The victim, Ernst Trox, was in his own yard at 20 Naushon Rd when the dog owned by Adam Bruneau "pushed through" his back yard fence and attacked the neighbor unprovoked. The dog knocked the victim to the ground and then latched onto his left arm. It was not until the dog's owner pulled the dog off of the victim that the attack ended.

The injured arm has needed multiple surgeries and skin grafts to repair the damage.

This complaint is made under the penalties of perjury.

On October 15, 2021 I, Wareham Animal Control Officer Gorveatt-Dill, responded to 18 Naushon Rd for a reported dog attack. I was met by a man who identified himself as the owner of the dog, described as a 10 year old, male, American Bull dog named flash, who had attacked his neighbor, 'Ernie". The dog owner, Adam Bruneau, who was obviously distraught. He stated his dog pushed threw his fence in an attempt to go after his neighbors small dog and when the owner reached down to protect the small dog his dog latched onto the mans arm resulting in serious injury. The victim, Ernst Trox, was transported to Tobey Hospital prior to my arrival. I served the dog owner a 10 day quarantine for the dog in hand. The dog owner also agreed to muzzle the dog and keep same on a leash at all time.

NARRATIVE FOR PATROL OFFICER JENNIFER BRALEY

On 10/15/2021 at 0754 hrs. I was dispatched to 20 Naushon Rd. for the report of a dog bite. Dispatch advised the victim was bleeding profusely and that the dog had been secured. Upon arrival, I spoke with the victim, Ernest Trox (DOB: 11/18/46) and it appeared that the bleeding to his left arm was under control. Trox's arm was wrapped in several towels and elevated. Trox stated that he was walking his dog when the neighbor's dog came running at him from behind it's fence. Trox stated the dog knocked him down and then grabbed his left arm with it's mouth, tearing the skin through the muscle, down to the bone. Trox stated his neighbor, Adam Bruneau (DOB: 09/26/84) immediately ran to him and the dog from the backyard. Trox stated that Bruneau immediately brought the dog in the house and returned with towels to help stop the bleeding.

I then spoke with Bruneau who remained with Trox. Bruneau stated that his 9 year old, American Bulldog was in the backyard, started barking and ran out of the backyard towards the street. Bruneau stated the dog knocked Trox down to the ground and then grabbed his arm. Bruneau stated that he grabbed the dog and secured him in the house in his crate. Bruneau stated that he doesn't understand why the dog went after Trox. He stated the dog has been to obedience training and has never behaved this way before. Bruneau stated that the dog is up-to-date with its vaccinations and his vet is Dr. Fall at Animal Health Clinic.

Due to the severity of Trox's injuries, he was transported to St. Luke's Hospital by Wareham EMS. Wareham DNR was notified and Bruneau was advised to quarantine the dog until given further instructions by Wareham DNR.

To reach out to community youth programs and non-profit organizations to help guide them in permitting processes in the town, research state funding and grants, find private funding and grants through corporate entities, assist youth that are interested in town politics in research and learning about town government, and more.

This Committee will be appointed by the Board of Selectmen and will consist of 7 members, each serving for three years.

The first appointments would be staggered; two to expire 6/30/23, two to expire 6/30/24 and three to expire 6/30/25.
