Ms. Morton excused herself to avoid conflict of interest with the discussion and possible vote for variance request for 2 Seahorse Lane.

**MOTION:** Mr. Tropeano made a motion to move Mr. Perry up to a voting member for this hearing only. Dr. Wiegandt seconded. Roll call: Mr. Tropeano-yes, Dr. Wiegandt-yes.

- 3. <u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE REGARDING VARIANCE REQUEST FOR 2 SEAHORSE LANE</u>
  Mr. Davignon from Schneider, Davignon & Leone, Inc. explained the proposed septic plan and variances. Variances to 310 CMR 15.404: Maximum feasible compliance:
  - 310 CMR 15.104, percolation testing; design per bottomless sand filter design manual vs. and actual percolation test.
  - 2. 310 CMR 15.212, depth to groundwater; leaching area separation from seasonal high groundwater requesting a 2.0' setback vs. 4.0' min. w/denitrification.
  - 3. 310 CMR 15.240 (4), soil absorption systems; design is for 2 bedrooms vs. the 3 bedroom minimum required no percolation test obtained and no room for 3 bedrooms.

During a group discussion regarding the variances, no action was taken.

# 4. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE VOTE REGARDING 10 ALBATROSS AVENUE

Mr. Iamele from JC Engineering, Inc. presented and explained the proposed septic plan and variances. Variances to 310 CMR 15.211:

- 1. A 0.8' variance (10.0'-9.2') for the minimum setback from the pump chamber to a foundation wall.
- 2. A 5.0' variance (10.0'-5.0') for the minimum setback from a SAS to the front property line.
- 3. A 4.0' variance (10.0'-6.0') for the minimum setback from a SAS to the side property line.

During a group discussion the Board agreed to all 3 variances with the agreement that the Engineer confirms the tank to be structurally sound.

**MOTION:** Mr. Tropeano made a motion to approve all 3 variances with the agreement that the tank to be structurally sound and certified as such. Ms. Morton seconded. Roll call: Mr. Tropeano-yes, Ms. Morton-yes, Dr. Wiegandt-yes.

VOTE: 3-0-0 (Unanimous)
