COMMERCIAL SOFT SHELL CLAM REGULATIONS

TOWN OF WAREHAM (November 1, 2016 to April 30, 2017)

1. AREAS:

- East River / Broad Cove (Area A)- those areas northerly of the Stone Bridge classified as "Approved for the Taking of Shellfish" by the Division of Marine Fisheries.
- Muddy Cove (Area B) those areas westerly of the Dummy Bridge only in areas classified as "Approved for the Taking of Shellfish" by the Division of Marine Fisheries.
- <u>Weweantic River</u> (Area C)- those areas that have been classified as "Approved for the Taking of Shellfish" by the Division of Marine Fisheries.
- Onset Pier East (Area D) the area easterly of the Onset Pier to the Point Independence Bridge
- <u>Point Independence Beach (Area E)</u> Between an area marked by an orange panel on the point of Point Independence to the Point Independence Yacht Club Pier at the end of Independence Lane.
- Broad Marsh River (Area F) Shellfish Management Area #2 that portion which has been classified as "Approved for the Taking of Shellfish" by the Division of Marine Fisheries. Special Regulations (Rainfall Status)- open only when the signs state the area is open to shellfishing and the recorded telephone message (291-3100 ext.3184) state the area is open to the taking of shellfish.
- <u>Butlers Cove/ Widows Cove/ Bass Cove/ Stoney Point Dike</u> (Area G) Those Areas that have been Classified as "Approved for the Taking of Shellfish" by the Division of Marine Fisheries.
- Shell Point Bay Management Area #4 (Area H) Those Areas that have been Classified as "Approved for the Taking of Shellfish" by the Division of Marine Fisheries. Excluding any portion of Onset Beach surrounding Shell Point.

2. DAYS/HOURS: Soft Shell Clams may be harvested:

- Area A & B Monday, Wednesday, and Fridays only
- Area C Tuesday and Thursdays only
- Area D Tuesday and Wednesdays only
- Area E Wednesday and Fridays only
- Area F Monday, Wednesday and Fridays only
- Area G Monday and Friday only
- Area H Monday and Wednesday only

(No harvesting on Thanksgiving Day/Christmas Day/New Years Day)

3. <u>AUTHORIZED DIGGERS:</u>

A soft shell clam permit will only be issued to those individuals who have held a Town of Wareham commercial shellfish permit for a minimum period of (1) one year prior to November 1, 2016

4. TEMPERATURE RESTRICTIONS:

Soft Shell Clams shall not be harvested when the air temperature is below thirty- two (32) Degrees Fahrenheit. It <u>shall</u> be the permit holder's responsibility to be cognizant of the air temperature at all times and each permit holder <u>shall</u> be required to have a thermometer in their possession while harvesting soft shell clams.

5. HARVEST LIMITS:

The daily limit is two (2) level bushels, per permit, to be contained in standard bushel totes as described in the General Shellfish regulations.

6. AUTHORIZED EQUIPMENT:

The only method of harvesting soft shell clams shall be the use of rakes and plungers. The use of any type of hydraulic equipment, shovels, spades, pitchforks, or similar equipment is strictly **prohibited**.

7. GENERAL REGULATIONS:

Unless otherwise directed by the Shellfish Constable, all seed shall be replanted in the immediate harvest area

All holes shall be filled in properly, with no seed left exposed.

The transfer of soft shell clams from one person to another or from one boat to another is prohibited.

The approved areas are subject to change / closure by the Division of Marine Fisheries and/or by the Board of Selectmen at the recommendation of Town of Wareham Shellfish Constable.

The permit fee is non-refundable.

All shellfish shall be properly tagged with harvest information prior to transporting.

All shellfish shall be covered during transportation to reduce the risk of contamination.

Any violation of the above provisions or as listed in the shellfish regulations by-laws shall result in a Hearing by the Town Administrator, or his designee, who may, in addition to any fine imposed, suspend any, or all Town of Wareham shellfish permit(s) issued to the violator for a period of time not to exceed thirty (30) days, in which case said violator shall be prohibited from any /all shellfishing. The decision of the Town Administrator, or his designee, shall be final and not subject to appeal.
