8. TOWN BUSINESS

a. Presentation by the School Building Committee.

Present before the Board: Joan Seamens, Kimberly Shaver-Hood, Judy Capriccio, Jeff Swett

The School Building Committee presented a project update involving building a new school on Minot Ave. which would replace the existing Minot Forest Elementary school. The MSBA Board of Directors will be meeting on June 27th at which time the school building committee will be seeking approval in order to proceed into full schematic design. They will also submit more concrete definitive schematic level estimates by October to present to the MSBA Board of Directors meeting on December 12th. If approved, construction could potentially start as early as 2019. Total project time is estimated to take two years, maybe less. The school building committee also stated that they do need to carry out three final evaluation options in order to meet the MSBA's requirements for approval. Add/reno, repair, and a new solution. The school building committee has voted on a three story solution. They are working with the Massachusetts Historical Commission regarding this sight because there are signs of archeological significance which must be researched in order to define what portions of the property can be used for building. This new construction would school 1020 students plus pre-kindergarten aged students and the cost is estimated to be \$87,000,000.00.

Selectman Teitelbaum said that the Board had previously voted to spend \$20,000.00 in the EDIC holdover funds to go towards an outreach coordinator which would be part of the function of the COA coordinator as well Derek Sullivan had also said that the COA director had retired and cannot work full time.
