Selectman Whiteside attended the Cemetery Commissioners hearing last night and the hearing went very well.

Selectman Tropeano wanted to applaud Melodye Conway on bringing awareness to opioid addiction. He spoke about all the purple flags on the front lawn of the Masonic Lodge and that each single flag represents a person who has passed away in Massachusetts from the addiction.

Selectman Slavin attended the Planning board meeting in which a dentist is trying to put up a building on 6 Recovery Road and will be back before the Planning board in 2 weeks.

Selectman Slavin attended the SRPEDD meeting in which they discussed the South Coast Rail. He said that in his opinion is we won't see the route to Stoughton due to budget constraints. He spoke about the plans for another station north of the station in Middleboro which should be complete by 2022.





1. SCR 1 Seat Ride - Reverse through Existing Middleborough/Lakeville Station (dismissed)


- Extend Middleborough/Lakeville trains to NB/FR with stop at existing Middleborough/Lakeville Station
- Requires minimum 15 minute turn time Would significantly impact operations to NB/FR
- Meet/pass conflicts
- Longest travel times for NB/FR riders (105+ min.)





3. SCR 1 Seat Ride - New Middleborough Station (preferred)

- Extend Middleborough/Lakeville trains to NB/FR with stop at new Middleborough Station
- Optimizes operations
- Shortest NB/FR travel time
- Supports future Cape shuttle service connection
- Maximize one-seat ride for majority of existing and new riders
- Existing Station can remain open for Cape Flyer service
- Travel time ~90 Minutes for peak period






Middleborough Center

- Only minor impacts to freight
- Minimizes property impacts


Cons

- Community opposition
- Requires vertical circulation
- Moderate construction impacts
- Moderate-significant traffic impacts
- With shuttle small parking capacity (200 spaces) will force more riders to park/shuttle from existing station
 - Without shuttle large parking lot would require significant property impacts
- Proximity/impact to Armory Building












Track Cross Section Comparison
