## 5. <u>CITIZENS COMMENTS</u>

Ms. Kenny wanted to express her opposition to the casino and asked what the next step the board planned on taking. Chairman Tropeano stated that they have to wait until the hurdles are cleared before even considering going on the November 2020 ballot in order to move forward. Selectman Munise said that the Gaming Commission has a meeting scheduled for the  $10^{\rm th}$  in Boston.

#### 6. **BOARDS COMMENTS**

Selectman Slavin mentioned that the State has sent out notices to Doctors and Hospitals informing them that it's not legal to sell CBD and that the Department of Agriculture hasn't set any rules as of yet. Chairman Tropeano stated that some

## 9. TOWN BUSINESS

Selectman Munise asked about the letter from the Attorney General and if any changes were being made. Chairman Tropeano spoke about the political signs and they are allowed due to freedom of speech.

  Attorney Bowen explained that the Attorney General's office did disapprove some of the sign bylaw but what was in the books stays on the books.
- c. Transfer of fee simple interest of Littleton Drive property.

  MOTION: Selectman Bruce moved to transfer the simple interest of Littleton Drive property to the Wareham Redevelopment Authority. Selectman Teitelbaum seconded and noted that both him and Selectman Bruce have signed disclosures with the Town Clerk regarding votes as Selectmen on requests from the Redevelopment Authority.

d. Discuss Police Department Feasibility Study Committee.

Mr. Sullivan suggested that the board follow the similar format that Bourne had which is 8 members, including: 1 BoS, 1 Finance Committee, 1 Capital Planning, 5 Citizens at Large, the Town Administrator, The Chief of Police and 2 staff members which will be ex officio.

### 10. TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Mr. Sullivan stated that the Council on Aging received a grant from the Executive Office of Elderly Affairs a \$20,000 grant for equipment and personnel for the Outreach Coordinator.

Mr. Sullivan spoke about a women having difficulty paying her excise and sewer bills and she was short \$60 and Mr. Foster said that someone paying their bill behind the woman stepped up and gave her the money.

## 11. LIAISON REPORTS/INITIATIVE REPORTS

Selectman Slavin stated that the good news from the State is that the fiscal year which just ended was \$1.1 billion over benchmark revenue, so the Governor has proposed a \$648 million supplement budget. Some of the things they are looking to use the money for is to increase Chapter 90 funds, clean water program and for EEE spraying.

Selectman Slavin also stated that as of September 24, 2019 the cable companies can renegotiate all their cable contracts.

Selectman Munise attended the Affordable Housing Trust meeting in which they interviewed the new member and they discussed outstanding issues. He said that

they are having a CMWRRD meeting coming up and they discussed the fees at their last meeting and they are also trying to get the audit complete.

Selectman Teitelbaum urged residents to take the EEE threat serious and will continue until a deep frost. He said that he hangs his spray in a bag on his door handle as a reminder to spray himself before leaving the house. He also asked for the board to hold an executive session to talk about the opioid litigation that other municipalities are involved in.
