
Status of Adoption: 2002




Status of Adoption: 2006





In CONGRESS July 4, 1776. 

Solution: "An Act to Sustain Community Preservation"

Major Components:

1. Change in deeds fee collection methodology to provide an increase in trust fund revenue for communities

If higher match is in place, then...

- 2. Allow flexibility on local CPA revenue sources (not just relying on property tax surcharge)
- 3. Allow CPA "rehabilitation" projects on existing recreational land






