Agenda Item 1 - School Improvement Update

The school improvement plan was presented to the School Committee and was approved. It included the following:

- 1. Improve MCAS ELA scores by 10%
 - a. MCAS ELA with using the following initiatives
 - i. Implement StudySync
 - ii. Increase # of Core Classes
 - iii. Implement NWEA data collection (3x's a year pre MCAS to evaluate students).
- 2. Improve MCAS Math scores by 10%
 - a. MCAS Math by using the following initiatives
 - i. Implement Illustrative Math
 - ii. Increase # of Core Classes
 - iii. Implement NWEA data collection (3x's a year pre MCAS to evaluate students).
- 3. Social-Emotional Learning/Climate
 - a. Increase educators, students, families and community members ability to support the healthy development of students.
 - i. ESS and TLC working together
 - ii. Implementing "Champions"
 - iii. Offering PD through Satchel Pulse
 - iv. Keep students in the school vs. sending out for assistance
- 4. Attendance Maintain a 95% or better student attendance rate in 2023 2024
 - a. Through the following processes

HOME OF THE VIKING SHIPS": Scholarship,	Citizenship, Craftsmanship, Leadership and Sportsmanship

- i. Monitor attendance daily
- ii. Initiate contact with parents/guardians regarding attendance
- iii. Dean's to follow up on chronic issues CRA's if necessary
- iv. Home visits
- v. Ongoing Dean/Guidance collaboration
- vi. Monthly meetings with juvenile probation officers

5. Discipline

- a. Decrease the out of school suspension rate for 2023 2024
 - i. Provide support for teachers and classroom feedback
 - ii. Utilize office detentions as a first tier or discipline
 - iii. Utilize in-school suspension as a second tier of discipline
 - iv. Suspend only when its a safety issue or have no other choice
 - v. CRA's will be filed in court for habitual offenders
 - vi. Offer access to educational programs in lieu of a long term suspension

Questions/Comments:

Joyce Bacchiocchi - How often do students choose the online class option to reduce suspension?

Mr. Palladino - Approx 80% choose the class option that is an increase from 50%.

Joyce Bacchiocchi - Are you evaluating new programs that will address Social and Emotional learning

Mr. Palladino - Yes, ESS is specifically for TLC students and families. Satchel Pulse is for the entire district and covers everyone, including helping parents directly trying to find counseling and support services.

Agenda Item 2 - Budget

Wareham High School is currency working within a situation where there will be cuts. We are expecting significant budget cuts for the 2024 - 2025 school year.

Attempts will be made to reduce costs across the board, including clubs and sports. Programs will be reviewed with participant numbers and once we have specific numbers we can outline cuts specifically.
