NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING

A Live Virtual Design Public Hearing will be hosted on the MassDOT website below to present the design for the proposed Corridor Improvements on Route 6 at Swifts Beach Road project in Wareham, MA.

WHEN: 6:00 PM, Wednesday June 21, 2023

PURPOSE: The purpose of this hearing is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed Corridor Improvements on Route 6 at Swifts Beach Road project. All views and comments submitted in response to the hearing will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

PROPOSAL: The proposed project consists of corridor improvements on Route 6 (Marion Road), from approximately 600 feet north of Cromesett Road to Wareham Town Hall. The travel lanes will be reduced from four to two (one in each direction), with 5-foot shoulders. Enhancements will be made to the intersection with Swifts Beach Road, including a new traffic signal and the addition of a left turn only lane. The existing signal at Wareham Plaza will also be upgraded. Pedestrian and bicycle access will be improved via reconstructed sidewalks on the northwesterly side of the roadway, a new 10-foot shared use path on the southeasterly side, and ADA-compliant curb ramps throughout the corridor.

A secure right-of-way is necessary for this project. Acquisitions in fee and permanent or temporary easements may be required. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts is responsible for acquiring all needed rights in private or public lands. MassDOT's policy concerning land acquisitions will be presented in the hearing.
