- How should vacant and underutilized industrial and other properties be redeveloped?
- Are recreational programs and facilities adequate? If not, what changes or improvements are needed?
- Should the town pursue opportunities to improve local housing conditions?
- Should the town consider regional approaches to addressing community needs?
- What type of projects should Community Development Block Grant funds be used for in town?

Wareham residents are invited to a Community Development Strategy meeting to be held on **Wednesday**, **January 31 at 6:30 PM** at Town Hall, 54 Marion Road. This meeting is being held as the Town prepares its FY 2018 grant application to the MA Department of Housing and Community Development.
