You may call our office at 508-291-3140 and make an appointment to vote in person at the Town Hall from April 19, 2021 during regular business hours until May 3 until noon.

(Town Hall Hours: Mon, Wed, and Thurs 8:15am to 6:00pm, Tues until 6:30pm, closed Fri)

AT THE POLLS:

Massachusetts regulations pertaining to social distancing and wearing a mask will be in place. Only 4 voters at a time per precinct will be allowed inside the Polls.

- Antibacterial wipes only for use on pens, styluses, tables, voting booths, doors and other exposed surfaces.
- Antiseptic Wipes and Microfiber cloth (only for use on voting machines)
- Hand sanitizer pump container for voters (75 % alcohol)
- Voter pens each voter to take a pen with the ballot. The voter is to take the pen with him/her upon leaving the polling location.
- Marks on the floor for 6foot distancing
