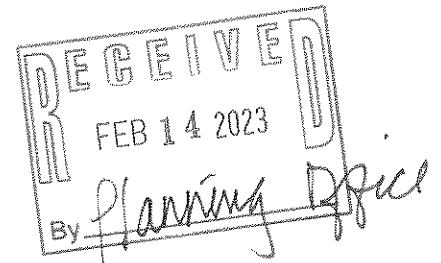

I am writing regarding Peace for Ponies/All Animals land in East Wareham that is currently under a zoning appeal to restrict their amount of animals allowed to be housed there, down to three.


